

Check out "<u>Ordeal on Mount Howson</u>" where PATC-MS members Sterling Hendricks and Donald Hubbard barely escape with their lives trying a first ascent of Mount Howson (Howson Peak) in 1957 with Rex Gibson, then President of the Alpine Club of Canada. It's only through a heroic effort of Sterling Hendricks that they survived. Not all were so lucky.
